1. What stands out to you in this passage?
2. Why didn't Jesus silence the people who addressed him as Messiah, as he had done previously?
3. How is Jesus' entry as King into Jerusalem different than how you might expect a King to enter a city?
4. The following OT passages associated Zion's King with the rescue of God's people. Identify the purpose of the King's coming in each passage:
 - o Zech. 9:11
 - o Is. 11:10-16
 - o Jer. 30:8-9
 - o Ezek. 34:22-23
5. Hosanna literally means "save" or "save now." What was Jesus coming to save?
6. What is being communicated about Jesus in the account of his entrance into Jerusalem?
7. Why do you think Jesus went to the temple and didn't stop at the gates of Jerusalem?
8. What do you learn about Jesus and about yourself in this passage?
